



# PREVENTING HOSPITALISATION PROVIDING SPECIALIST GERIATRIC SERVICES TO NURSING HOMES

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In **Dublin North Central** (DNC) the Nursing Homes (NH) bed capacity has increased by **21%** since 2013, with a bed capacity of 1660 at present. In 2022, 21771 people over 65 attended Misericordiae University Hospital Mater Emergency Department (MMUH ED), an increase of 15% from 2019.



Provide specialist geriatric consultation for older adults living in nursing homes in the **MMUH** catchment area.

## **SCOPE OF PRACTICE**

WHAT WE DO

We provide our services to older adults > 65 who reside across 20 NH with a total bed capacity of 1660.

Promote appropriate **hospital avoidance** through collaboration of hospital, nursing home, primary care and extended-care team.

To facilitate appropriate/early **discharge** from Emergency Department and Hospital Ward.

Provide **timely access** to geriatric services to older adults and provide support in accessing appropriate care pathway.

Support, empower, educate and enable nursing home staff as well as family/carers.

### **REFERRAL PATHWAY**

**GP referral** for older persons (>65) living in nursing homes.

Follow-up nursing home residents after attending MMUH ED.

Medical referral post-discharge from the MMUH.

Post- discharge from **other** hospitals; Connolly Hospital, Beaumont Hospital, St Mary's Hospital, Fairview PACS, etc.

#### **NURSING HOME RESIDENTS** (N=3076)


- Median age **84.2 years**

- 70% dementia diagnosed
- 60% high or maximum **dependency**
- Total of **3215** NH's residents in our database



#### THE RESULTS

Despite the steady increase of ED attendance of people >65 and number of NH beds, the percentage of NH residents has remained below 3% for the last 4 years. In 2022, 21771 people >65 attended ED of which 2.87% represented NH residents. This demonstrates a significant decrease compared to 2010 when 4.33% of the 9744 people >65 attending ED were nursing home residents. 






Nursing Home residents typically have complex needs and several comorbidities, making them some of the most vulnerable individuals in our country.
